After the diagnosis, the military was put on the backburner, while my health and schooling became my new focus. I was under an extreme amount of stress with chemotherapy and the thought of how I was going to attend or even afford college. That was when an extreme burden was lifted by you with your incredibly generous donation of over \$1,000.
